ST. JOHN'S HOSPICE The weather improves but the need remains.

St. John's Hospice has been providing services for the homeless men of Philadelphia since 1963. In addition to providing over 3,000 meals each week, St. John's also provides residence for over 250 homeless men each year; case management, medical assistance and counseling for residents and day services guests; mailroom services for over 900 men, approximately 160 showers with clean clothing, underwear and shoes every week; and emergency shelter for 27 homeless men where they can receive a meal & bed every night.

You can help. Each month on the 2nd Thursday the Green Truck from St. John's comes to SMG to collect your donations of your homemade casseroles (they supply the pans & lids, you provide the home cooking*), sample toiletries you brought home from your travels (shampoo, lotions, razors & shaving cream, soap, etc. NO MOUTHWASH PLEASE!), and coffee, tea, sugar, creamer, etc.

Just pick up a casserole pan & lid in the Ministries Room (just past the rest rooms at church) and bring it back full, frozen and labeled with the date prepared and main ingredients. Each pans is meant to feed 6 - 8 and to be eaten with a plastic 'spork' — a combination spoon & fork so pieces should be relatively small. Casseroles go in the freezer; other donation go in the cupboard next to the freezer.
