HOW DO WE HELP WHEN THEY ARE **BEGGING FOR HELP?**

In recent weeks we have once again* been faced with strangers to Goretti begging for help. There is no denying, we have a reputation for generosity!

But how do we know we are helping? In this day and age, how do we know we're not supporting some scam? That the cash (and they seem to only want cash or gift cards) is being used for food or rent, not drugs or worse? Should we just say "No" or risk doing harm by saying "Yes"?

There is an alternative — Send them to SVdP@SMG!! 215-721 -0199 x224. Our voice mail box is monitored daily. Calls are returned promptly. We can help with food, emergency shelter, rent, etc. We know the local social services agencies that can help. We'll go to them & meet with them as neighbors. If a 'band-aid' is needed (one time help), we can help. If it is a long term problem, we can help and help them find more long term help.

*In the past, local police have confirmed that those begging at local churches have been part of organized gangs using the poor, homeless or undocumented to beg for money; the gang takes all or most of it. We have found that those who truly need

help, let us help. Those just looking for cash, move on. PLEASE NOTE: This is the same process we use for all our neighbors in need — they don't need to be strangers.
