TODAY'S READINGS

Reading I: Isaiah 43: 16-21

Yahweh is identified by a series of actions He performed in Israel's past at the first exodus. Now the prophet tells the Babylonian exiles that a greater exodus is coming.

Reading II: Philippians 3: 8-14

Paul's "knowing" Christ, that means 1n an intimate and personal way, fosters his involvement. He hopes that this identification with Christ and trust in His resurrection, will be his salvation on Judgment Day.

The Gospel: John 8: 1-11

Scholars tell us that this story was added late to the text, only coming in at the 3rd century. It certainly illustrates the statement of Jesus that comes a few verses later, namely: "I pass judgment on no one." (8:15)



SVDP MONTHLY FOOD DRIVE

The Society of St. Vincent De Paul at St. Maria Goretti Parish will collect groceries for local charities next weekend, April 9-10. Please take a bag from the Church vestibule and return it next weekend with groceries for one of the charities indicated below.

Martha's Choice Marketplace, sponsored by Catholic Social Services, is the largest, most visited food pantry in Montgomery County. It needs personal care items such as shampoo, deodorant, feminine hygiene pads; tampons, diapers sizes 5 and 6, small bottles of dish detergent; adult nutritional drinks such as Ensure, healthy lunchbox fillers for kids, household cleaners; and laundry detergent.

<u>Lamb Foundation</u> provides affordable housing and support services to senior citizens and adults with mental, physical, and developmental difficulties. It needs canned or instant soup, canned vegetables (no beans), shampoo; Dial soap, Depends (men's or women's), feminine pads and laundry detergent.

Emmanuel Evangelical Congregational Church helps low-income families, senior citizens, single parents, unemployed individuals, the working poor, adults with mental, physical, and developmental disabilities, and others in need of assistance. It needs sugar, flour, cold cereal (no oatmeal); ground coffee, salad dressing, cooking oil; mayonnaise, ketchup, olives (green or black); canned mushrooms, dry pasta (especially lasagna noodles but not spaghetti), plain white rice (20-lb. bags are OK); 1-gallon zip-lock bags, 13-gallon trash bags, dishwashing liquid; laundry detergent, body wash, hair conditioner, razors and shaving cream.

The Society cannot distribute opened packages, expired items, perishables, or religious articles. Cans and plastic containers are preferable to glass.
