

BAPTISM

Baptisms are celebrated every Sunday at 12:45 pm (except the first Sunday of each month). Please call the Parish Office to register for Baptism. Pre-Jordan classes required for parents and optional for godparents, are offered the second Wednesday of each month at 7:00 pm in the Parish Center unless otherwise noted in the bulletin. Baptisms are limited to **ONE CHILD** per Sunday. **Letters of eligibility are due at the Parish Center before a date can be given for Baptism.**

<u>Marriage</u>

Arrangements must be made with a priest at least six months in advance. You must speak to a priest before making arrangements for a reception hall. Scheduling, rescheduling or cancellation MUST be done by a priest. Pre-Cana classes are required for all couples. Pastoral Letter from Archbishop Nelson J. Pérez

WELCOME BACK—WE MISSED YOU

Archbishop Nelson J. Pérez, and all Catholic Bishops in Pennsylvania will reinstate the obligation to attend Mass in person on Sundays and Holy Days beginning on Sunday, August 15, 2021, the Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary.

This obligation, as is always the case, does not apply to those who are seriously ill, have a serious health risk, as well as those who have serious anxiety about being a part of large groups at this time. Likewise, the obligation does not apply to those who care for those who cannot attend Mass in person (Catechism of the Catholic Church, no. 2181). Those who are legitimately excused from Mass on Sundays and Holy Days are encouraged to spend time in prayer, meditating on the Death and Resurrection of the Lord, reading the Sacred Scriptures, and uniting themselves to Christ in his worship of the Father of us all. Those who are legitimately excused are also encouraged to view a broadcast of the Mass which is intended for those who cannot participate in person.

CATECHESIS OF THE GOOD SHEPHERD 2021-2022 Registration



The Catechesis of the Good Shepherd (CGS) program is a Montessori based parish religious formation/education program for children age 3 to 6 (Kindergarten) in LEVEL 1 and age 6 to 9 (grades 1 & 2) in LEVEL 2 with a primary goal to nurture a relationship with God. This is accomplished by the

SVDP MONTHLY FOOD DRIVE



The Society of St. Vincent De Paul at St. Maria Goretti Parish will collect groceries for local charities next weekend, August 14-15. Please take a bag from the Church vestibule and return it next weekend with

groceries for one of the charities indicated below.

Martha's Choice Marketplace, sponsored by the Archdiocese of Philadelphia, is the largest, most visited food pantry in Montgomery County, serving more than one thousand families and thirty-five hundred individuals each month. It needs feminine hygiene products, diapers sizes 4-6, cooking oil; adult nutritional items such as Ensure, healthy breakfast items for kids, lunchbox fillers; personal care items, laundry detergent, paper products; and general groceries.

Shepherd's Shelf provides groceries and other household items to approximately one hundred ten needy households per month. It needs strawberry jam, tomato paste, kitty litter; dry cat food, applesauce, pancake mix; syrup, Chef Boyardee canned meals, gluten free items; napkins, first aid items, feminine hygiene products; deodorant, body wash, unscented laundry detergent; dish detergent, and individual snack bags (ie. pretzels, chips, crackers, but NOT granola bars).

Hatfield Church of the Brethren operates a food pantry for residents of Hatfield Township and Borough. It needs canned fruit, canned salmon, cereal; canned tomatoes (whole or diced), baby food, cake mixes and icing; shampoo, deodorant, and feminine hygiene products.

The Society cannot distribute opened packages, expired items, perishables, or religious articles. Cans and plastic containers are preferable to glass.
