#### SVDP MONTHLY FOOD DRIVE



The Society of St. Vincent De Paul at St. Maria Goretti Parish will collect groceries for local charities next weekend. December 12-13th. Please take a bag from the Church vestibule and return it next weekend with groceries for one of the charities indicated below.

The Lamb Foundation provides affordable housing and support services to senior citizens and adults with mental, physical, and developmental disabilities. The Foundation needs canned or instant soup, canned fruit, canned vegetables (no beans or baked beans); shampoo, Dial soap, laundry detergent; white sox, Depends (men's or women's), and feminine pads.

The Keystone Opportunity Center operates a food pantry serving nearly a thousand neighbors who are dealing with food insecurity. The Center needs pancake mix, oatmeal, jelly; canned fruit, pasta, pasta sauce; canned potatoes, salmon, chicken; canned spaghetti-o's, Beefaroni, ravioli; canned corn, green beans, laundry detergent; dish detergent, body wash, shampoo; conditioners, toothpaste, and deodorant.

Manna on Main Street operates a soup kitchen and food pantry that last year served nearly forty thousand meals. It needs canned meats, spices (salt, pepper, garlic), canned soups; dried fruit, tomato sauce, canned tomatoes; pasta, rice, canned fruit; condiments, breakfast cereals, pancake mix; baked beans, peanut butter, canned carrots; toilet paper, tissues, paper towels; diapers (especially sizes 4, 6, and pull-ups), baby wipes, and baby hygiene items (shampoos, lotions, and powders); razors, deodorants, and toothpaste; shower gel, hand soap, feminine pads; shampoo, lotions, and conditioners; lip balm, petroleum jelly, cleaning products; and pet food.
