Abortion Through The Eyes Of Christ Man's ability to terminate human pregnancies, and if that termination is just or unjust, has been a debate throughout the country and the world for several decades. The 1973 debate Roe V. Wade brought great attention to this issue. It is important when discussing this topic that both sides of the argument, whether pregnancy termination is just or unjust, listen to opposing points as the reality of abortion may entail multiple valid dimensions to consider. Webster dictionary claims the definition of life is the the existence of an individual including the capacity for growth, reproduction, functional activity, and conditional change preceding death. The dictionary also claims that the definition of murder is an unlawful premeditated killing of one human being by another. Termination of pregnancy is unjust*and therefore immoral due to the Virtue approach, or the writer's personal moral philosophy. Adding onto this argument, an individual contains the capacity to grow and process from conception until birth. Enforcing the act of abortion should be illegal because it goes against both virtue, moral philosophy and the Catholic faith*

One real life example representing the immorality of abortion is the story of Gianna lessen. Jessen's biological mother had a saline abortion, which is when saline is injected into the mother's womb ultimately causing a multitude of life ending physiological complications. Her biological mother would give birth to a dead fetus within twenty-four hours. To everyone's surprise, Gianna was bom alive, not dead. At seven and a half months, Gianna lessen had a heartbeat as well as eyes, ears and a tongue. All of her muscles had been formed. She could kick, hiccup, frown and even squint. Every organ in Gianna was present even at eight weeks. Giannas' sex could be determined and her brain had created billions of nerve cells. She could feel pain and as saline was injected into her, Gianna would pull away from it knowing she was in a state of danger. The abortionist had to sign Gianna's birth certificate which states "Bom during saline abortion" ("Jassen Testimony"). As Gianna researched all about the physician who tried to terminate her, she came across something he said that stood out to her. "I have aborted over a million babies and I consider it my passion" ("Jassen Testimony"). Gianna was diagnosed was cerebral palsy, which was caused by the lack of oxygen going to her brain while she was trying to survive. Her reaction to her failed termination attempt is summarized when she states: "If abortion was merely about women's rights ladies and gentlemen, than where was mine?" ("Jassen Testimony"). Janssen has used her testimony in public speaking to government officials, church leaders and feminist. Her story is one that shows the love of God for his children. Keeping her alive, Jassen uses her platform to share the love of God to all close enough to listen. "The right to life is the first among human rights. To abort a child is to kill someone who can not defend himself." Pope Francis.

Federal law prohibits destroying the egg of a bald eagle and the punishment contains several thousand dollars or a year in jail. There is a big difference between a bald eagle and a human life, yet there is no punishment when committing murder to a human being. Human life is sacred because from its beginning it involves the creative action of God. Urban dictionary states that the definition of murder is the unlawful premeditated killing of one human being by another. What makes the human inside of you and less of a person then you are? "A person is a person, no matter how small," Dr. Seuss. Truthfully, abortion has come down to who has a voice vs. who doesn't. That child has a heartbeat, a living heart beat. That child is alive and they are blooming into the individuals that God has created them to be . Then they are stripped. We are literally killing God's creation, we are killing our own. We are killing our future generations and world changers. One third of my generation is missing, one third. This is an issue that needs to be addressed. It is not about rights, because if abortion was about rights then the child inside of you would not be tom into pieces if they had a right. That child has a right that is being violated by abortion clinics all across the world, especially Planned Parenthood. It is a scientific fact that a humans life begins at conception. Human life; the most beautiful gift of all. We are destroying God's masterpieces.

Genesis 1:26-31; 2:4-25 "Tells us this, "God created man in his image; in the divine image he created him; male and female he created them." I have volunteered at "A Baby's Breath" for the past two years which is a Catholic organization that advocates for anti-abortion. They provide families with educational lessons such as resume building, mock interviews and life skills needed to have a successful future for individuals and their children. They work alongside of parents who have turned away from abortion and have decided to raise their beautiful children. A Baby's Breath provides families with clothing, toiletries, diappers, food and anything your child would need. I have watched teen mothers walk into the ultrasound room not sure whether they will keep their baby or not. I have seen every teen mother that has walked into the room afraid, scared and unsure, walk out about to take on a whole new life for their child, Imagine if we put money into these types of organizations that help make it possible for mothers to keep their children instead of the ones that strip a life. If it is not right to take a life of someone on the street, what makes it right to take a life away from a human who lives inside of you?

There are so many alternatives to aborting a baby: Adoption, temporary foster care, family members who can raise the child, and seeking support are all very good alternatives for abortion. One of these alternative is a crisis pregnancy resource center, "A Baby's Breath" women may receive support in choosing life for their baby. A Baby's Breath provides educational lessons from how to do CPR to help create an effective resume for a job. With these organizations, less excuses for aborting a child will be made which will stop killing future generations. With the money used to help fund Planned Parenthood, imagine how many babies America could save by giving the money to organization such as "A Baby's Breath" that is a non-profit. Planned Parenthood is funded through the federal government. Although many will say the government does not give money directly for the abortions, the government is giving money to provide for the abortions. Imagine if the Federal Government invested that much money into the foster care system. "According to Planned ParentHood, the federal government gave the institution \$528 last year" (Kurtzleben 1). Planned Parenthood has made 220.9 million dollars on aborting innocent human beings.

In conclusion, there are a lot of different ways to go about abortion because for the majority, there seems to be no compromise. However, killing the future generations needs to be controlled and abortion needs to be put to a end. It is not morally correct to choose who dies and who lives, nor is it morally correct that our government is funding the biggest abortion institution of all times and giving so little for America's foster care system.
