BAPTISM

Baptisms are celebrated every Sunday at 12:45 pm (except the first Sunday). Please call the Parish Office to set up an appointment to meet with a priest or deacon to complete the necessary paperwork. Pre-Jordan classes required for parents and optional for godparents, they are offered the second Wednesday of each month at 7:00 pm in the Parish Center unless otherwise noted in the bulletin. Letters of eligibility are due at the Parish Center before a date can be given for Baptism.

Before leaving our church building each weekend, please consider stopping by one of our poor boxes located in the narthex, with your contribution. This Crisis Pregnancy Center currently has four locations which include Jeffersonville, Collegeville, Bryn Mawr, and Warminster, PA. The center is comprised of caring individuals, who are all volunteers, and provide many free and confidential services which include ultrasound services, pregnancy counseling, parenting classes, natural family planning classes, prenatal classes, post-abortive support, chastity counseling, GED training/tutoring, and the "Loving Our Life Support Group". CATHOLIC RELIEF SERVICES SPOTLIGHT

War and conflict have forced more than 2.8 million people in Ethiopia to flee their homes to other parts of the country. Adbi Abbas and his family left everything behind when they fled Somaliland. They arrived in eastern Ethiopia with 7,800 other internally displaced persons. Adbi, his wife and their children lived in an open warehouse with 500 other displaced people. There was no bathroom, access to clean water, or privacy to be able to care for their small children.

All 500 people were sleeping inside the large hall during the night and cooking and surviving in the same place during the day. To improve conditions, CRS hired skilled carpenters from within the displaced population to help construct homes. In addition, CRS programs repaired water systems, provided health, sanitation and hygiene items, and offered nutrition supplements to refugees. The assistance that CRS is able to give to refugees such as these would not be possible without the poverty-focused U.S. foreign aid programs found in the federal budget. As we begin to engage this new Congress, please urge your representatives to support foreign aid programs in the FY2019 federal budget.
