Thus while Saint Maria Goretti is universally known as the Patroness of Purity, her greatest virtue was her unvielding forgiveness of her attacker even in the midst of horrendous physical suffering, a forgiveness that would completely convert him and set him on a path to personal holiness."

Hatfield Community Churches need lunchbox fillers for children ages two through five: granola bars, fruit packs, raisin boxes; juice boxes, pudding packs, squeeze applesauce; cracker sandwich packs, snack-size Goldfish crackers, and Teddy Grahams. They also need canned mandarin oranges, pineapple, tuna; canned peas, corn, mixed vegetables; canned beets, diced tomatoes, whole tomatoes; cereal, spaghetti sauce, pasta; laundry detergent, dish detergent, hand soap; bar soap, shampoo, and deodorant; paper towels, toilet paper, and diapers; and feminine hygiene products.

# FATHER MICHAEL MCGIVNEY TO **BE BEATIFIED**

Pope Francis has approved a miracle attributed to the intercession of Venerable Father Michael J. McGivney. The approved miracle involved an unborn child in the United States who was healed in utero of a life-threatening condition in 2015 after prayers by his family to Father McGivney. The Pope's action means that Father McGivney can be declared Blessed, the step just prior to Sainthood. An additional miracle attributed to Father McGivney's intercession will be required for his canonization as a saint. Father McGivney was a Connecticut priest who served his flock during the pandemic of 1890, before himself becoming ill and dying of pneumonia, with the underlying condition of tuberculosis. He is best known as Founder of the Knights of Columbus in 1882. Nearly a century before the Second Vatican Council, his prescient vision empowered the laity to serve Church and neighbor in a new way. Today, the Knights of Co-lumbus is one of the largest Catholic organizations in the world with 2 million members in North and Latin America, the Caribbean, Asia and Europe. A date will soon be set for the beatification Mass, which will take place in the Archdiocese of Hartford, Connecticut. The ceremony will include the reading of an apostolic letter from the Holy Father and the bestowing of the title Blessed on Father McGivney.
