

CELEBRATING THE 130th ANNIVERSARY OF SAINT MARIA GORETTI'S BIRTH



This October 16th, the Church celebrates the birthday of our beloved parish patroness Saint Maria Goretti. Frequently upheld as a model of youthful purity, many members of the Church are surprised to discover that this young virgin and martyr is also greatly venerated for her forgiveness.

"Saint Maria Goretti is a fitting example of purity for all. But there is something much deeper within Maria from which her glory flows, a glory out of which her purity is a fruit: her identification with the Mercy of Christ. To miss sight of this is to miss out on the particular charism with which God blessed her. Thus while Saint Maria Goretti is universally known as the Patroness of Purity, her greatest virtue was her unyielding forgiveness of her attacker even in the midst of horrendous physical suffering, a forgiveness that would completely convert him and set him on a path to personal holiness."

WELCOME LITTLE SISTERS OF THE POOR

In 1869 Archbishop Wood of Philadelphia invited the Little Sisters of the poor from France to come and assist in caring for the vast numbers of elderly poor in the city. The Charism of their Foundress, St. Jeanne Jugan, serving the poorest in simplicity, humility and trust in Divine Providence (begging), imbued them with the gift of fortitude for 150 years in Philadelphia through faithfully observing their vows of poverty, chastity, obedience and hospitality while personally assisting the dying with the firm belief-"It is Jesus Himself whom you are serving in the Poor." JJ **Next weekend** the Little Sister will be appealing for your financial assistance to support their work. Your support is greatly appreciated and is God's tangible providential assistance to the poor.

FATHER MICHAEL MCGIVNEY TO BE BEATIFIED

Pope Francis has approved a miracle attributed to the intercession of Venerable Father Michael J. McGivney. The approved miracle involved an unborn child in the United States who was healed in utero of a life-threatening condition in 2015 after prayers by his family to Father McGivney. The Pope's action means that Father McGivney can be declared Blessed, the step just prior to Sainthood. An additional miracle attributed to Father McGivney's intercession will be required for his canonization as a saint. Father McGivney was a Connecticut priest who served his flock during the pandemic of 1890, before himself becoming ill and dying of pneumonia, with the underlying condition of tuberculosis. He is best known as Founder of the Knights of Columbus in 1882. Nearly a century before the Second Vatican Council, his prescient vision empowered the laity to serve Church and neighbor in a new way. Today, the Knights of Columbus is one of the largest Catholic organizations in the world with 2 million members in North and Latin America, the Caribbean, Asia and Europe. A date will soon be set for the beatification Mass, which will take place in the Archdiocese of Hartford, Connecticut. The ceremony will include the reading of an apostolic letter from the Holy Father and the bestowing of the title Blessed on Father McGivney.
