## JOIN US STARTING TONIGHT!! September 20, 21 & 22, 2020 FORTY HOURS DEVOTION

The celebration of our annual Forty Hours Devotion will provide a needed and wonderful opportunity for the spiritual growth of all persons, and of the parish as a whole, allowing everyone to focus on the Holy Eucharist. If you are longing to find peace in your heart, you will find it in the heart of Jesus with whom you will have the opportunity to spend time to be at peace while seeking comfort and guidance during these challenging times. This year we are pleased to have Father Michael Mullan as our guest homilist to share his thoughts with you.

The number "forty" has often signified a sacred period of time: the rains during the time of Noah lasted forty days and forty nights; the Jewish people wandered through the desert for forty years on their journey to the Promised Land; our Lord fasted and prayed for forty days before beginning His public ministry; and the Forty Hours Devotion commemorates the time from our Lord's burial until His Resurrection.

This Devotion originated in Milan, Italy during the 16th century. Through the efforts of the Jesuits, led by St. Ignatius of Loyola, it became widespread by the end of the 18th Century. It was introduced, after meeting resistance, in our country in Philadelphia by St. John Neumann in 1853.

Our Forty Hours Devotion begins at the end of the 11:30 a.m. Mass on September 20th. There will be Eucharistic Adoration in the Church following that Mass until the beginning of the Vietnamese Mass. Adoration will resume after the Vietnamese Mass, and will conclude with Evening Prayer at 7:00 p.m., which will include Benediction and a Eucharistic Blessing. Adoration will resume after the 8:30 a.m. Mass on Monday, September 21st, and will continue throughout the day, concluding with a Penance Service at 7:00 p.m. which will include Benediction, a Eucharistic Blessing and an opportunity for confessions. Adoration will again resume after the 8:30 a.m. Mass on Tuesday, September 22nd, and will continue throughout the day. The Devotion will conclude with Evening Prayer, beginning at 7:00 p.m. that evening, a Solemn Eucharistic Procession within the Church followed by Benediction with a Eucharistic Blessing.

We have made it our priority to keep the people of SMG parish safe. Every precaution has been put in place for your safety such as; all high touch areas will be sanitized after each Mass, and prior to the Forty Hour Devotions, the missals have been removed from the pews, seating is socially distanced, hand sanitizers are available, masks are required for everyone except those under 2 years old or with health issues that prevent you from wearing a mask, doors will be propped open so entering and exiting the church is easy. Every other pew is open for seating, remember to leave 6 foot space between your household and members of a different household. Let us pray that we will find peace and feel safe as we gather for this special devotion. May God bless you. ALL ARE WELCOME!

## FATHER MICHAEL MCGIVNEY TO **BE BEATIFIED**

Pope Francis has approved a miracle attributed to the intercession of Venerable Father Michael J. McGivney. The approved miracle involved an unborn child in the United States who was healed in utero of a life-threatening condition in 2015 after prayers by his family to Father McGivney. The Pope's action means that Father McGivney can be declared Blessed, the step just prior to Sainthood. An additional miracle attributed to Father McGivney's intercession will be required for his canonization as a saint. Father McGivney was a Connecticut priest who served his flock during the pandemic of 1890, before himself becoming ill and dying of pneumonia, with the underlying condition of tuberculosis. He is best known as Founder of the Knights of Columbus in 1882. Nearly a century before the Second Vatican Council, his prescient vision empowered the laity to serve Church and neighbor in a new way. Today, the Knights of Columbus is one of the largest Catholic organizations in the world with 2 million members in North and Latin America, the Caribbean, Asia and Europe. A date will soon be set for the beatification Mass, which will take place in the Archdiocese of Hartford, Connecticut. The ceremony will include the reading of an apostolic letter from the Holy Father and the bestowing of the title Blessed on Father McGivney.
