# SAVE THE DATES September 20, 21 & 22, 2020 FORTY HOURS DEVOTION

The celebration of our annual Forty Hours Devotion will provide a needed and wonderful opportunity for the spiritual growth of all persons, and of the parish as a whole, allowing everyone to focus on the Holy Eucharist. If you are longing to find peace in your heart, you will find it in the heart of Jesus with whom you will have the opportunity to spend time to be at peace while seeking comfort and guidance during these challenging times. This year we are pleased to have Father Michael Mullan as our guest homilist to share his thoughts with you.

The number "forty" has often signified a sacred period of time: the rains during the time of Noah lasted forty days and forty nights; the Jewish people wandered through the desert for forty years on their journey to the Promised Land; our Lord fasted and prayed for forty days before beginning His public ministry; and the Forty Hours Devotion commemorates the time from our Lord's burial until His Resurrection.

This Devotion originated in Milan, Italy during the 16th century. Through the efforts of the Jesuits, led by St. Ignatius of Loyola, it became widespread by the end of the 18th Century. It was introduced, after meeting resistance, in our country in Philadelphia by St. John Neumann in 1853.

Our Forty Hours Devotion begins at the end of the 11:30 a.m. Mass on September 20th. There will be Eucharistic Adoration in the Church following that Mass until the beginning of the Vietnamese Mass. Adoration will resume after the Vietnamese Mass, and will conclude with Evening Prayer at 7:00 p.m., which will include Benediction and a Eucharistic Blessing. Adoration will resume after the 8:30 a.m. Mass on Monday, September 21st, and will continue throughout the day, concluding with a Penance Service at 7:00 p.m. which will include Benediction, a Eucharistic Blessing and an opportunity for confessions. Adoration will again resume after the 8:30 a.m. Mass on Tuesday, September 22nd, and will continue throughout the day. The Devotion will conclude with Evening Prayer, beginning at 7:00 p.m. that evening, a Solemn Eucharistic Procession within the Church followed by Benediction with a Eucharistic Blessing.

We have made it our priority to keep the people of SMG parish safe. Every precaution has been put in place for your safety such as; all high touch areas will be sanitized after each Mass, and prior to the Forty Hour Devotions, the missals have been removed from the pews, seating is socially distanced, hand sanitizers are available, masks are required for everyone except those under 2 years old or with health issues that prevent you from wearing a mask, doors will be propped open so entering and exiting the church is easy. Every other pew is open for seating, remember to leave 6 foot space between your household and members of a different household. Let us pray that we will find peace and feel safe as we gather for this special devotion. May God bless you. ALL ARE WELCOME!

Paul teaches his readers that charity always has a role in Christian conduct. Nor is it to be limited to fellow Christians. Love is ultimately the complete fulfillment of the Mosaic law.

# The Gospel: Matthew 18: 15-20

Matthew has Jesus speak in a way unlike anything else He has said, with references to matters like the Church, which did not yet exist. Still, the teaching about fraternal correction is timeless. Later comes the consoling words of His guarantee of presence in any gathering of two or more made in His name.

### SVDP MONTHLY FOOD DRIVE



The Society of St. Vincent De Paul will conduct its monthly food drive next weekend. Please take a brown bag from the Church vestibule and return it next weekend with groceries for the charities listed below. Cans and plastic containers are preferable to glass, and opened or expired items cannot be accepted. May God bless you for your generosity!

Manna on Main Street's most immediate needs are for size 5 and 6 diapers, dessert mix, snack-sized chips and crackers; canned fruit, and cereal. Manna also needs these food items: canned meats (Spam, ham, seafood), canned soups, spices (salt, pepper, garlic powder); dried fruit (raisins, apples, dates), canned tomato sauce, canned tomatoes (diced or whole); pasta, rice, condiments; pancake mix, canned beans, dried beans; canned vegetables (except corn and green beans), peanut butter, and pet food. Soda, candy, and junk food are not needed.

Manna also needs these non-food items: diapers (all sizes), baby wipes, baby items (shampoos, lotions, powders); Pull-ups. feminine hygiene products, laundry detergent; toilet paper, tissues, paper towels; razors, deodorants, toothpaste; alcohol-free mouthwash, shower gel, hand soap; lotions, lip balm, Vaseline; bathroom cleaners, window cleaners, dish soap; hair brushes, shampoos, and conditioners.

Laurel House's most immediate needs are for Lysol disinfectant spray, antibacterial cleaning wipes, paper towels; prepackaged chips, snacks, and cookies; microwaveable meals, and cereal. Laurel House also needs PopTarts, fruit snacks, granola bars; crackers, pudding, canned soup; ramen noodles, cereal, oatmeal; pasta, pasta sauce, jelly; canned tuna, canned chicken, macaroni & cheese; pancake mix, cake mix, brownie mix; antibacterial cleaners, cleaning gloves, bleach; baby wipes, diapers (sized 3 - 6), and Pull-ups (3T-4T, 4T-5T).
